14 February - Bordering on Insanity - Timothy Walker

No apologies for inviting back one of our most popular speakers. His first presentation to us was in 2003 when he spoke about a year in the life of the Oxford Botanic Garden, where he had started his horticultural career as a post graduate having read Botany at University College, Oxford, and where he became Director of the Botanic Gardens. This time he looks exclusively at the herbaceous border in his wife's garden, covering the principles and practicalities of creating a border that is interesting all-year-round.


A Card from Buckingham Palace!



It has been 'All Change' at the WGC train station recently, with 2 projects completed alongside our regular planting, watering and tending. Since the creation of the large flower

beds on platforms 3/4 last year, the team has improved the soil and pruned back the hedges leaving a large space to fill.

Luckily, we were offered plants by Garden on a Roll, owned by the Society's President Antony Henn. He brought over 100 plants to the station, placing them carefully and explaining each specimen to the volunteers. We worked hard to get them all dug in and will be looking after them very carefully over the winter and looking forward to a fantastic display next year.



Another recent highlight is the installation of an original station name sign in the waiting room on platform 3. This sign was rescued by Malcolm Cowan when it was decommissioned so we are very grateful to him for looking after it and loaning it to the display. The waiting room also features old travel posters and a gallery of historical images so there's plenty to see while you wait for a train.
